## Objectives in spending PPG and summary of spending and actions taken:

Current issues:

Whole School Maths, including introduction of Times Table test.

SEMH of vulnerable pupils impacts on attainment/progress –increase in Play Therapy, Thrive Approach to be rolled to support and monitor vulnerable pupils. SCARF to be further exploited through its use in assemblies.

Progress of targeted PPG pupils to be supported by Inclusion Manager (those at risk of not making progress based on analysis of last year's data).

Improve and further develop the second Forest School area on school site.

Increase in EAL champion support, particularly in Foundation Stage as this cohort are made up of 25% of pupils learning EAL. Increase hours to accommodate rise in EAL pupils.

To support the development of expressive speech, narrative in Literacy.

Continue to promote high attendance as part of a positive work ethos across the school.

SENCo – continued development of communication with parents and outside agencies. Development of school to school support for SENCos due to LA funding cuts.
